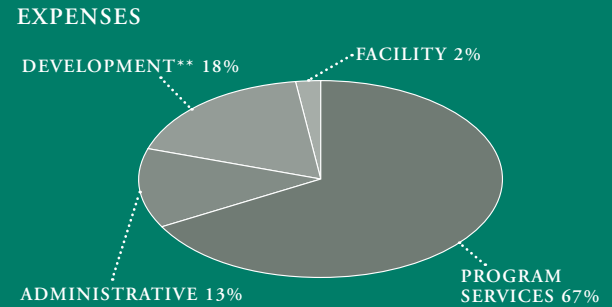
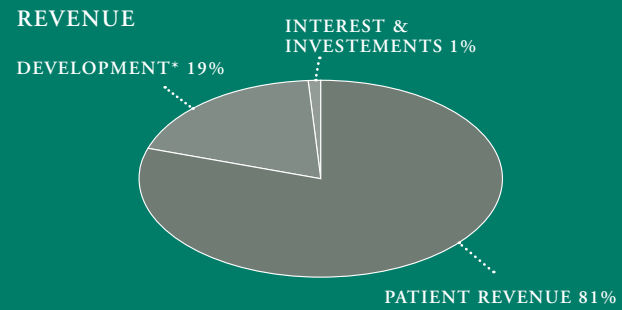

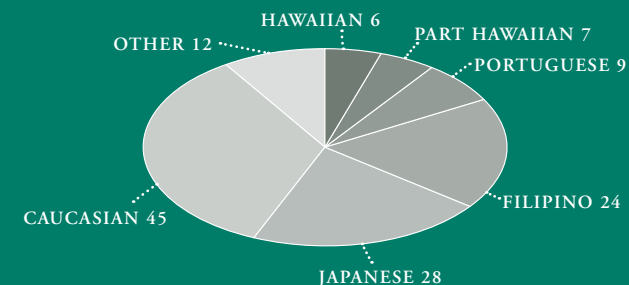
Statement of Financial Position†



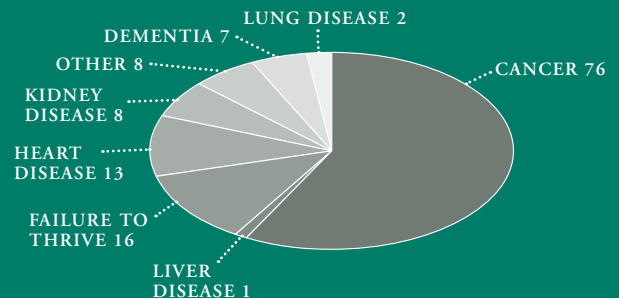

Service Demographics

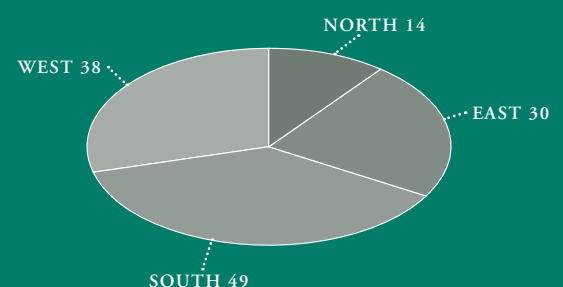
PATIENTS BY ETHNICITY (TOTAL 131)

ONE WOMAN'S STORY: Grief as a Crash Course in Living.

I believe in feelings—and dreams and visions—all possible ways to perceive our own circumstances. Each of us who understands death as a real experience—the end of life as we know it—has unique ways of taking in and processing our perceptions. Some of us have dreams of our beloved, some sense their presence in familiar places, some carry photos close to our heart.

Together, though, we share a language – not so much of words, but of sensation, heartfelt, gut level:

- sorrow
- anguish
- stunned awareness

We share this strange thing called grief. Though many have written about it, there's really no preparation – it's always a crash course.

We can share, too, another side of the experience of death, equally intense: the measure of grief is the measure of our capacity to love. I think it is very important for each person to recognize: "Yes, I did love – I am capable of great love."

memories of our loved ones: quirky expressions, unique ways of laughing, favorite foods – instead of agonizing grief, the memories call up clarity, a slow smile of remembrance, even joy for the privilege of having had that person in our life.

We can identify our loved one with something larger than his or her physical body – with a greater gift – the lasting contribution of his or her uniqueness.

I often feel that some of my beloved's characteristics are now mine. From my son Kawika, his pragmatic way of looking at things, and from my husband, Abid, his deep, patient, attentive listening to another's story.

Perhaps you, too, notice that some particular aspect of your beloved's personality or habits have become a part of you as well. Because we are in the middle of living a life, we continue to breathe in and breathe out. The gifts from our dead help us get through our own living.

Over time—over time, a transformation occurs. A miracle of our personal healing begins to permeate our dreams, infuse our cells, and we have a sense that "things are okay." The
